You don't have to be a rocket scientist or a biblical scholar to find the connections between the crucifixion of Jesus and God's command to Abraham to offer up his son Isaac as a sacrifice.

Both Isaac and Jesus were loved by their fathers. Both were en route to their death: Isaac carrying the wood for the fire; Jesus carrying the wood of the cross. Isaac's journey was three days; Jesus' from death to resurrection was also three days. The Genesis story concludes with God's lastminute change of mind. Isaac is spared.
