<u>**EDUCATION**</u> – Classes will be held on Sundays, April 11 and 18, 8:30 AM.



CEMETERY GUIDELINES APRIL 1 TO OCTOBER 31 (MOWING SEASON)

- + There is a limit of two (2) memorial items allowed per plot and within the confines of the stone. Items are not to be placed anywhere in the grassy area of the plot. Examples include anything that inhibits mowing or trimming, such as statues, planters, rocks, seats, solar-powered lights, etc.
- + Flags may be placed on graves Memorial Day, the Fourth of July, Flag Day, and Veterans Day. Flags are subject to removal by the Cemetery Board within ten (10) days after the holiday.
- + By the end of April, please clean up around your family site. Anything left unattended or unsightly will be disposed of.
- **Please observe these guidelines so that we must not remove items from your loved one's grave. Thank you!
