#### We Are Part of the Flock That Gathers

Enter, let us bow down in worship; let us kneel before the Lord who made us. For he is our God, we are the people he shepherds, the sheep in his hands. Oh, that today you would hear his voice. (Psalm 95:6–7)

It is nice to belong. The prayer of this psalm alludes to the communal reality of our faith: we are not alone in our relationship with God but part of a larger flock. Too often the messages we receive from the cultures and society around us lead us to believe that what is most important is the fulfillment of our individual desires or wants; that we should look out for ourselves first and then maybe consider others; and that it is even foolish to put the needs or interests of others before our own. Sometimes a culture of individualism and self-centeredness creeps into the practice of our faith and views of the world.

People who focus on their "personal relationship with Jesus" to the exclusion of what that relationship means for how they relate to others have succumbed to this temptation to individualism. In Christianity, there is no such thing as an "independent" Christian or a "sole proprietor" Christian or a "rogue" Christian. Christianity has one flock, one vine, one kingdom where all can gather.

As we continue our journey of faith, may we join the psalmist in giving praise and worship to the God who loves us all, who loves us together, and who guides us by means of the Holy Spirit. May we recognize that what I do for my sisters and brothers is, as Jesus says in Matthew 25, worth far more than what I say with my words or claim to believe in my heart. God remains steadfast as our Good Shepherd. We—God's people—must remember we are first and foremost a flock with others in this life. (Fr. Daniel P. Horan, OFM)

## JR. HIGH & HIGH SCHOOL RELIGIOUS ED

Classes for Grades 6 through 10 next week, May 7,8:30 AM. Last class for the year!

<u>175 YEARS</u> – Fr. John Rager was pastor at St. Maurice beginning in 1909 and served the congregation for ten years. He is remembered for building the new brick parochial school. He wrote, "In a Congregational meeting today (May 1, 1910), it was decided to build a new School Building, providing sufficient funds be raised." Accordingly, the pastor was asked to visit each family of the congregation in order to ascertain what contribution each family would make in cash or labor. Bishop Chartrand blessed the new school amid an assembly of visiting priests on October 11, 1911.

Following Fr. Rager, Fr. Henry Hunger was pastor from 1920 until 1927, and then Fr. Aloysius Duffy until 1934. The parochial school was closed in 1927, but from 1929 until at least 1939, the building was leased by the Jackson township trustees for public school use. In exchange, the trustees installed indoor plumbing and a steam boiler, which heated the church as well as the school.

#### **PARISH PROJECTS**

- The Cemetery Fencing will be completed by Vinyl Solutions of Greensburg for a cost of \$10,600.00 in either May or the first of June. Donations are being sought for this project, and if necessary, the remaining cost will come from our Cemetery Fund. At this time, I have received \$1,500 in donations.
- The protective glass on the church windows is definitely in need of repair. This keeps the protective glass in place. We have obtained one estimate and will be seeking a second one. This expense will come from this year's Maintenance budget.
- Microphone System for the Parish Hall: Designed Sound and Video has given us an estimate, but at this time, we are still in the discussion phase. It would be my hope that the expense of this project would come from donations.
