It is likely that Jesus sat near the Ark of the Covenant in the synagogue at Nazareth. He looked out at the familiar faces from his hometown. They had always known him as the son of Joseph, the carpenter. As the Torah was carried back to the ark, they chanted the Eighteen Blessings. The chazan handed Jesus the scroll from Isaiah. After reading it, Jesus said: "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

More than 2,000 years later, this Gospel still challenges us. We might ask, "Is Jesus really that fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy?" Do we really claim him as the Lord of our lives? Some of his hometown people tried to kill him for this claim. Will we defend him today? (Deacon Dick Folger)
