
July 14 – Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



SUNDAY REFLECTION

Today, we hear the famous story of the good Samaritan. After telling how the priest, Levite, and Samaritan responded to the robbed and beaten man at the side of the road, Jesus asks the scholar of the law, "Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" This Gospel is a kind of midterm exam on our journey to eternity. How have we responded in similar circumstances? Were we like the priest or Levite who avoided the confrontation? Or have we, like the Samaritan, acted out of compassion? In our life situations, have we offered to help, to listen, to care? Jesus challenges the scholar of the law, and us, to be like the compassionate Samaritan: "Go and do likewise." (Deacon Dick Folger)
