

SUNDAY REFLECTION

Two phrases in the Gospel might challenge us in practical ways: First, "Jesus had crossed again ... to the other side." His "crossing over" brought him into two situations in need of healing. Crossing over might be a reminder to us to go out of our way to help someone. Or, perhaps, positioning ourselves to look at a situation from another's point of view, even an opposing one.

Second, "Who has touched my clothes?" shows us a Jesus who is aware of his surroundings, not out of fear but in readiness to respond to those in need. As individuals and faith communities, we are challenged by Jesus to be alert to welcoming, listening, healing, and forgiving.
