SUNDAY REFLECTION

Oh that we could say once a week or even once a month that someone "took offense" at us like they did of Jesus. It might be speaking up to family or friends when a racial slur is used or when a person is teased because of their appearance, or, or, or ... There are numerous such occasions when we often choose to be silent or to laugh politely in order not to offend.

Another option is at least to support the one who dares to offend like Jesus did. At times like these, we might intentionally recall God's message to Paul, "My grace is sufficient for you."

Including Youth

Youth are often attracted to the (perceived) spectacular — especially by entertainers. Sometimes God, sadly, appears ordinary by comparison, just as Jesus did in today's Gospel. Without minimizing the talent or integrity of the performers (make this very clear!), propose which name they would think of or call out to from a burning building or when being pursued by a pack of wild dogs. Some choices: Rihanna, Maroon 5, Eminem, Lady Gaga, and God.

Paul's "thorn in the flesh" is subject to much speculation – perhaps a spiritual weakness or repeated mistake. It's tempting for youth, after another failure yet again, to conclude, "Why even try to fight it?"
