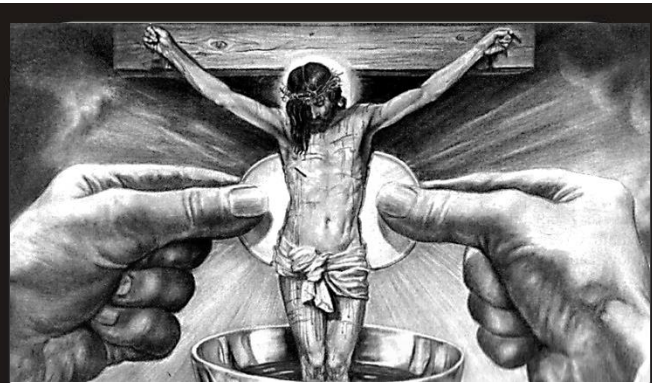


June 23 – Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

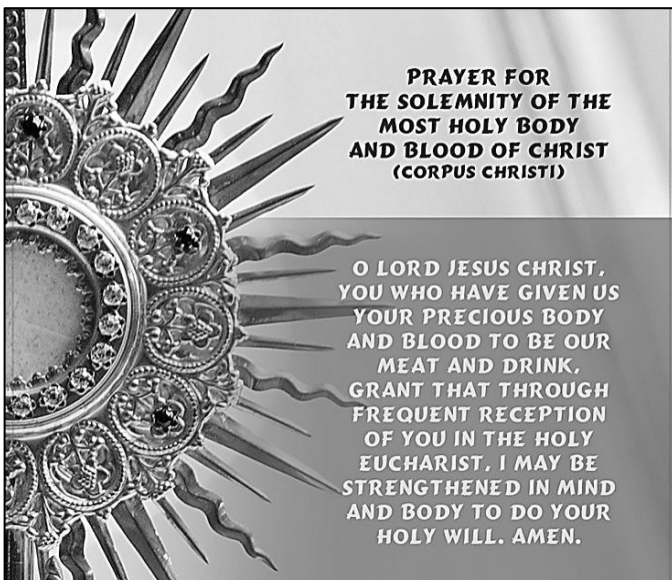

SUNDAY REFLECTION

According to the historian Josephus Flavius, there were about 200 Jewish villages in all of Galilee at the time of Jesus. Researchers have estimated that there were about 200,000 people in the entire region of Galilee. Today’s Gospel describes the feeding of 5,000 men. With women and children, the hungry could have totaled about 15,000, roughly ten times the population of Capernaum -- an unprecedented percentage of Galileans.

As we file up in the Communion line in our gathering of faithful followers at Mass this weekend, God comes to each of us one to one. Closing our eyes in prayer, we are part of the continuing miracle of faith. (Deacon Dick Folger)
