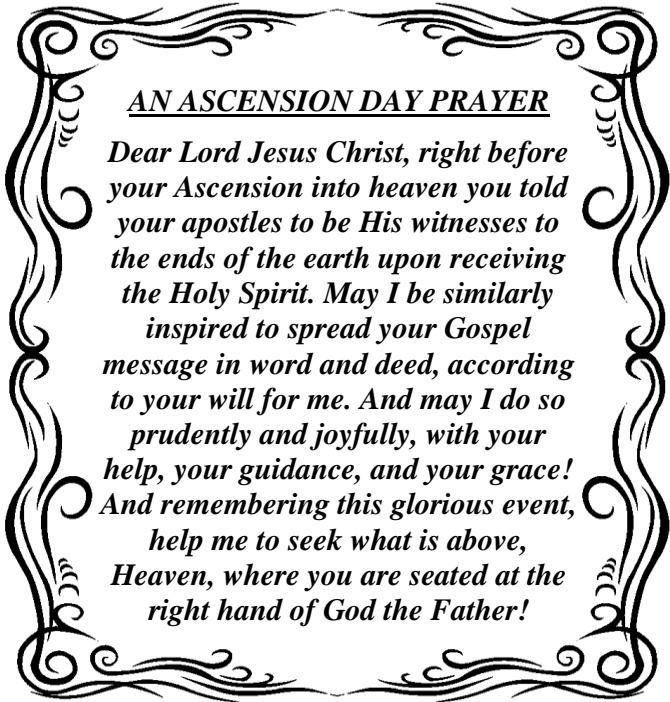

**SUNDAY REFLECTION**
