
June 4 – Feast of the Most Holy Trinity



WAYS TO HONOR THE TRINITY

- 1. Embrace the greatest commandment: love the triune God "with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind" (Mt 22:37), and the second most important commandment, to "love your neighbor as yourself" (22:39).
- 2. Say the Trinitarian prayer often: "Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit...."
- 3. Honor God the Father by our generosity, imitating the First Person's self-communicating love: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son" (Jn 3:16).
- 4. Honor God the Son by imitating the healing and evangelizing ministry of Jesus, who was God's missionary.
- 5. Honor God the Holy Spirit by seeking to build up God's kingdom and witnessing to Jesus' saving love wherever we go: "When the Holy Spirit comes upon you...you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8). (Fr. Leonard Foley)

HALL MICROPHONE SYSTEM — At the last Finance and Parish Council meetings, both groups approved the installation of a new microphone system for the Parish Hall. The cost is \$9,000. Through the efforts of Ron Wagner and myself, we have raised \$8,375 of the \$9,000, thanks to our generous parish donors. It is our hope that this system will be installed by the end of June by Design System from Greensburg.

<u>RELIGIOUS EDUCATION</u> – This week begins the Summer Religion Week for our children. Preschool, Kindergarten, and Grades 1, 3, 4, and 5 will meet on June 5, 6, and 7 from 6:00 to 8:30 PM. Children in our First Communion class will meet <u>each</u> evening at the same time. The First Communion Mass will be celebrated next Sunday, June 11, 1:30 PM.

<u>175 YEARS</u> – NCCW Then & Now – One of the earliest meetings of the St. Maurice NCCW (now known as the Mary and Martha Circle) was held in the parish school on October 28, 1957. Officers of the organization were Lucille Youngman, Alma Scholle, Dolores Wagner, and Eileen Wagner. Forty-three women were in attendance.

Dues were set at 25 cents a month, payable to the treasurer. The ladies were asked to receive Communion in a body at the 7:00 AM Mass on the first Sunday of every month. Six women were appointed to clean church during the coming month, and Clara Marie Wagner volunteered to launder the side altar linens. After the meeting, Fr. Walsh of St. Martin's in Yorkville showed color slides of his trip to Rome and South America. (How wonderful our ladies are still cleaning the church each week!)
