#### **SUNDAY REFLECTIONS**

Our nation was founded and flourished as we declared, "In God we trust." As we turn away from God, trouble begins within our lands. It has happened before.

The hand of God is traced in the great events of history. In 589 B.C.E., King Nebuchadnezzar of the Babylonian empire destroyed Jerusalem and leveled the Temple. The Jews were taken to Babylon and placed in captivity. They grew old, dreaming of their lost land. After half a century, the Lord anointed Cyrus, the King of Persia, grasping his right hand. In 539 B.C.E., Cyrus marched toward Jerusalem. There, he took and rebuilt the city. He restored the Temple, fulfilling the words of the prophet Jeremiah. God still sends messages to us today.
