Where Are You Looking

Are we, like the disciples, looking in the wrong direction? As they looked up to heaven, they probably realized what they had lost. Jesus was no longer in their midst. But then, the Easter stories all tell us that they never really understood his risen presence with them. And so, they were asked: "Why are you standing here looking at the sky?" (Acts 1:11).

Are we also looking up to heaven when we should be looking out to the world? Of course, it is right that we reflect on Jesus' ascension. However, today's understanding of the universe helps us realize that the biblical account of Jesus' ascension into heaven may be a way of saying that he is glorified with God. As Paul says, he has been granted the place of honor at God's right hand, "far above every principality, authority, power, and dominion" with "all things beneath his feet" (Ephesians 1:21–22). Jesus, now with God, radiates the full splendor of his resurrection.

We must turn to the Gospel passage to get the fullness of the story of the ascension. Jesus did not say: "Watch what is going to happen." Instead, he told them to go out: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). We might know these words so well that we miss their forcefulness. In effect, Jesus is telling them: go out to the whole world and tell them what you have seen and heard. I did what it was for me to do; now it is up to you to do the rest. Don't worry, "I am with you always" (Matthew 28:20). Look where you are going, not where I went. (Sr. Dianne Bergant, CSA)

<u>RELIGIOUS EDUCATION</u> – Summer Religion Week is scheduled for June 5 to June 9, from 6:00 to 8:30 PM. Children in our First Communion class are required to attend. The First Communion Mass will be celebrated on June 11, 1:30 PM.

<u>175 YEARS</u> – From 1957 through 1974, Fr. Michael Djubasz was pastor of St. Maurice. His work included the organization of the ladies' N.C.C.W. group and construction of the parish hall in 1960. He also introduced the congregation to liturgical changes brought about by the Second Vatican Council: celebrating Mass in English while facing the congregation and having lay people (server boys) as lectors. Fr. Djubasz was responsible for the 1963-64 major remodeling in church when the white spired altars were replaced with natural maple altars and sanctuary adornments, and the floor was carpeted.

When Fr. Mike retired at the end of 1974, St. Maurice was without a resident pastor. Msgr. Joseph Brokhage, who was then the archdiocesan personnel director for priests, became the parish administrator. He continued to live and work in Indianapolis and traveled to Napoleon for the weekend Masses, weddings, funerals, baptisms, and meetings. In 1977, Benedictine Sister Mary Cecile Deken was hired as pastoral associate and director of religious education. Msgr. Brokhage organized a Parish Council and Board of Education and introduced concepts like ecumenism, adult education, lay ministers of the Eucharist, and coffee and donuts after Mass. He encouraged the parish to repair and remodel the old school building and the rectory. Msgr. and Sister Mary Cecile worked hard to train lay catechists and build up the CCD program for the children on Monday evenings and teenagers after Sunday Mass. They worked together among the people of Napoleon until 1991.
