Father, break open the tomb.

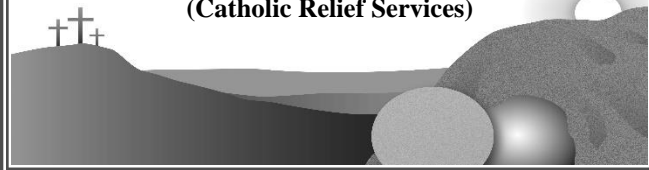
Where I've buried my sense of joy,

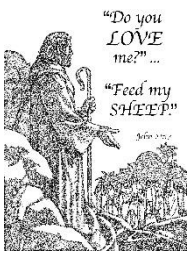
