

God of Surprises and Second Chances

If you asked somebody to do something and they didn't do it, you might give them a second chance. If they failed to do it the second time, your patience might be stretched a bit. You just might ask them a third time. But if they failed the third time, you would definitely give up on them. Thankfully, our ways are not God's ways. God clearly has more patience with us that we have with ourselves and each other.

Jesus tells the chief priest and the elders the parable of the owner sending workers into his vineyard to collect the harvest. Like all the parables, this parable is held up to us so that we can see ourselves in it and learn from it. Through the life, mission, death, and resurrection of Jesus, God offers the chance to reap an endlessly abundant harvest of love, mercy and forgiveness. They are offered to us freely out of love. Like those in the gospel, we have to choose freely whether to accept or decline God's generous offer. We are the tenants today and God has certain expectations of us. God looks to us to produce the fruits of love, mercy, compassion and the values of the Kingdom of God. The question from this parable to us today is simple but challenging: what sort of fruits and harvest are we producing through our ordinary daily lives as followers of Jesus? (Michael Moore OMI)

<u>**THE LORD'S LAUGHTER**</u> – A four-year-old boy told his father: "Dad, I've decided to get married."


"Do you have a girl in mind?" the father asked.

September - Month of the Seven Sorrows of Mary



The Seven Sorrows Rosary dates back to the Middle Ages, and Our Lady requests the faithful to pray the Seven Sorrows Rosary on Tuesdays and Fridays. St. Alphonsus Liguori revealed in his book The Glories of Mary that Jesus has four promises for those who devote themselves to Mary's seven sorrows:

1) "That those who invoke the divine mother by her sorrows, before death will merit to obtain true repentance of all their sins."

2) "That he will protect such in their tribulations, especially at the hour of death."

3) "That he will impress upon them the memory of his passion, and that they shall have their reward for it in heaven."
4) "That he will commit such devout servants to the hands of Mary, that she may dispose of them according to her pleasure, and obtain for them all the graces she desires."
